Central Executive Committee
Resolutions

The following resolutions were unanimously adopted during the 2-day CEC meeting held at STFI office, Shadipur, New Delhi from 08-05-2016 to 09-05-2016.

1. It was unanimously adopted by all the CEC members to strengthen the Association from the Unit level. The CEC members pledged to work harder to establish a rapport between them and the JNV units and SECs.
2. It was unanimously proposed to address a letter to the Ranchi JNV to transfer the funds collected from the staff in connection with the CCS Pension Case to AINVSA CEC, Warangal as the Association was in dire need of funds.
3. It was also unanimously proposed to write a letter to SEC Madhya Pradesh to transfer the contributions raised by it to the CEC account as the shortage of funds was handicapping the CEC's activities.
4. It was also proposed to organise relay hunger strikes from July 25th -30th by all the JNVs. All the Association members will participate in the relay hunger strike in batches on the campus. The SECs will activate the JNV units to participate in the relay hunger strikes.
5. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS management to convert the non-teaching staff working in JNVs, ROs and Headquarters into a single cadre.
6. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS management to make a cadre review of the non-teaching staff.
7. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS management to convert the TGTs into all India Cadre employees.
8. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS management to fill all vacancies in all cadres so that the JNVs are strengthened. It is not possible to strengthen the JNVs academically with teaching posts lying vacant in huge numbers.
9. It was unanimously resolved to request the NVS not to make the North-eastern region a dumping ground for teachers given transfer on disciplinary grounds or teachers who have just been recruited. Similarly Kutch and Gadchiroli. Such actions will have negative impact on children studying in those schools. The children studying in these schools have a right to be taught by experienced teachers as much as the children in other regions. It was unanimously decided to demand the NVS to transfer teachers cadre-wise to fill the vacancies in the north-east region.

10. It was unanimously resolved to pay the annual affiliation fee for the Confederation of Central Government Employees and Workers. It was agreed to send representation to Dehradun-Trade Union Education Camp and Chennai annual conference of the Confederation.
11. It was unanimously resolved to observe the birth anniversary of Savitribai Phule on 3rd January as Women Teachers' Day as well as Girl Child Education Day.
12. It was unanimously resolved to observe the International Women's Day on 8th March befittingly in every JNV and honour the women employees and female family members of the teaching and non-teaching staff.
13. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS management to amend the recruitment rules for the principal post by removing the 50 years age bar for the in-service PGTs.
14. It was unanimously resolved to oppose the NVS efforts to appoint the Deputy Commissioners on deputation basis, ignoring the experienced regular Assistant commissioners. Recruitment rules should be amended to do justice to the in-service Assistant Commissioners.
15. It was unanimously resolved to adopt a new logo for the association. The new logo will represent all the different cadres of the employee working in JNVs. It was also agreed to have a flag and an inspiring song.
16. It was unanimously decided to demand the NVS management to enhance the mess charges from the present Rs1200+280 to Rs.Rs1500+500 as the rates of all essential provisions and vegetable prices are rising.
17. It was unanimously resolved to appeal to the NVS management to introduce an innovative project in all JNVs to minimise water and paper wastage and electricity consumption. The management should ban burning of biodegradable waste on the campus. The JNVs should be a role model to the nation.
18. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS management to ban collecting of donations from the parents at the time of admission of their children as JNVs are meant to impart education free of cost to all.
19. It was unanimously adopted to demand the NVS management to follow the norms of the government of India and guidelines of the CBSE and give necessary guidelines to the librarians to write off books that are no longer usable.

20. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS management to treat the daily wage workers as casual labourers and make payment accordingly. It was sad to see many unskilled people being exploited and underpaid for years together.
21. It was decided unanimously to demand the NVS management to empower the principal to pass the medical reimbursement bills up to Rs.50000 per annum.
22. It was also unanimously decided to demand the NVS to transfer the interest that has accrued in the JNV accounts from the subscriptions of the association members to the CEC, Warangal bank account.
23. It was also unanimously demanded the NVS management to expedite the appointments made on compassionate grounds to redress the agony of the family of the deceased employees and increase the percentage of compassionate appointments from 5% to 15%.
24. It was unanimously resolved to demand the NVS to introduce 5-day week to the non-teaching staff at JNVs on a par with their counterparts working in the regional offices and headquarters.
25. It was unanimously resolved to go on relay strike from 25th July to 30th July protesting the delay in the recognition of the service associations and other demands.
26. The CEC also passed a resolution profusely thanking the Telangana and Andhra Pradesh JNV units and SECs for sparing their funds to meet the expenses of the CEC meeting.
